



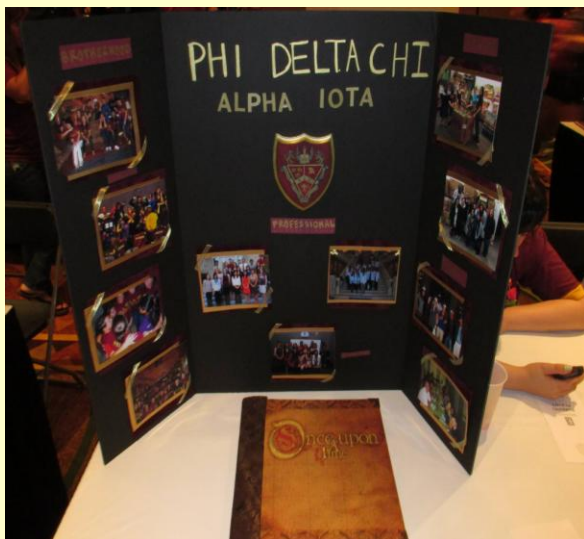
Grand Council Sendoff Dinner/Comedy Show!
